
RELEASE: Rising Atlanta Talent Jordan Brower's Lead Single "So Much To Say" Off Forthcoming Close Enough EP

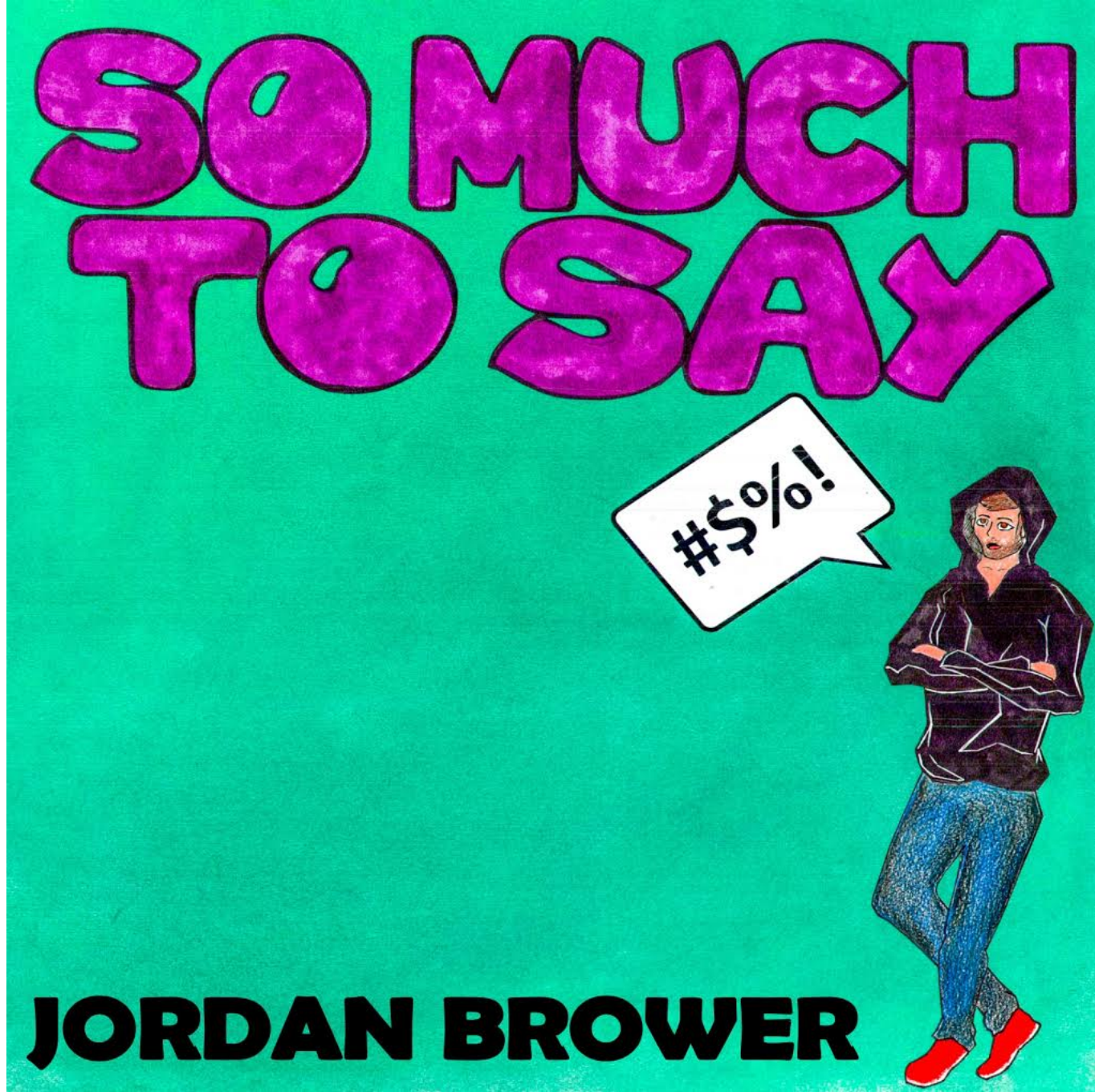
Rising Atlanta musician Jordan Brower is announcing his forthcoming EP, *Close Enough*, with the release of its lead single "**So Much to Say**" on Feb. 21. We've been searching for the right publication to debut and thought it might be a good fit with the content you've been releasing.

Atlanta-based artist [Jordan Brower](#) has had a whirlwind few years—from working in various production roles, as both a session musician and production assistant, to the organizing of live events in Athens. Nevertheless, Brower continued to produce hits, working on projects both for his own solo catharsis (last year, singles "[Chlorine](#)," "[Ignorance is Bliss](#)") and in collaboration with local rappers most often drawn to the producer by his skills in vocal engineering. Now, after years of honing his craft, [Brower](#) is releasing his latest EP, *Close Enough*, and, today, you can check out its first single, "So Much to Say."

Scheduled for release on **Feb. 21**, "So Much to Say" is influenced by Hip-Hop greats—from J. Cole to Mac Miller—and merges Brower's ability to produce tranquil, at times atmospheric beats with his Drake-reminiscent delivery. Allowing for a touch of vulnerability and hope, Brower's self-possessed yet candid songwriting is skillfully woven throughout and bookended with a catchy hook.

Of "So Much to Say," Brower said:

“I actually caught inspiration for this beat from Mac Miller’s “What’s the Use?” a few days after his passing (peep the whole bass line). Expanding on the vibe he began, I wanted to acknowledge and convey my own perspective, my own relationship and the optimism I have for the future of it.”

"So Much to Say" is just a hint of what's to come as with the single comes the announcement of Brower's *Close Enough EP*, scheduled for release **on March 14**. *Close Enough* shows the depth of Brower's versatility and creative discretion both in production (such as the carefully-curated features on "PEAKING," highlighting [Wix Patton](#) and [Deni Val](#)) and songwriting (from the introspective lyrical testimony in the vein of J. Cole's "Kevin's Heart" on "Jordan's Heart" to the unapologetically crass rejection in "Only One.")

Of the EP, Brower said:

“It’s important for me to include the different elements of Hip-Hop, R&B, and Pop music that have inspired me and my sound

thus far," said Brower. "From the creation of the beat to the writing and recording, I feel like this song, and EP, really display the work I've put in and the possibilities that are ahead for me."
